Year 9 Test Week, April 2020

Year 9 students will be sitting tests in the Sports Hall from Monday 20th – Thursday 23rd April. 

English

Details of exam

45 minute exam

Topic: An Inspector Calls

Students will receive a single essay question for *An Inspector Calls* – they will need to write a response to the question, using their knowledge of the play. This is a closed book exam (students will not have access to copies of the text), so it is imperative that students revise carefully.

Skills assessed:

- The ability to read and understand key ideas in the play.
- The ability to develop a personal response to the play.
- The use of quotations to support student responses.
- The analysis of language, form and structure to support personal response.
- The use of relevant contexts or ideas about the playwright's message to inform personal response.

Revision tips / websites / guides:

The best resource is a student's own book as this will have lessons on each of the above skills. There will also be a small revision pack on Show My Homework to support independent preparation for exam.

Other useful sources include:

- BBC Bitesize
- Mr Bruff channel on Youtube
- York Notes workbook and guide to An Inspector Calls, available from Waterstones and on Amazon
- A copy of the play itself: An Inspector Calls by J B Priestley

Students are advised to spend time making revision resources about key themes and characters in the play; memorising important quotations and ensuring they are confident writing about the play's two significant contexts: 1912 and 1945 and the writer's message.

Equipment required

Black pen and possibly a highlighter for highlighting key words in the question.

French, German & Spanish

Details of exam

I am doing German, French or Spanish next year:

Your test will be 50 minutes long and you will do a writing exam.

Describe a picture - 4 sentences

Translation into English

90 word task.

I am not doing a language next year:

Your test will be 50 minutes long and you will do a *really big* vocab challenge. When you complete this you will be given a percentage score and based on this will be awarded a gold, silver or bronze certificate for your knowledge of the language.

Topics covered

I am doing German, French or Spanish next year:

The test will be on the two modules studied this year in your class.

I am not doing a language next year:

The test will be on vocabulary which you have learnt over the last 3 years.

Geography

Details of exam

The exam will be one hour in length and structured like a GCSE paper. Students will be expected to answer all questions. Question structure may include data or map interpretation whereby the student will be expected to describe and explain key trends. Students will also be expected to answer questions of up to nine marks in length which will involve in depth prose responses. It is advisable to name places where possible and to use data from graphs to support answers.

Topics covered

Natural Hazards - Types of plate boundaries, layers of the earth, types of crust. Why do earthquakes happen? An example of an earthquake (eg. Kobe) - impacts and responses. Living with volcanoes

Climate Change - What is climate change? What is global warming? What are the natural causes / what are the human causes? What is it like to live in Tuvalu? What will the impacts be for the UK? How can we reduce the impact through adaptation and mitigation. What does it mean to think globally and act locally

Revision tips / websites / guides

Revision has been set using the education site 'Seneca'. An access code has been shared on Showmyhomework. Students are expected to use this site, which will be monitored. It will be treated as homework, so if pupils have not completed at least 2 hours before the exam, they will be treated as having not done the homework.

Equipment required

Black pen, pencil, ruler, calculator, protractor and a pair of compasses.

History

Details of exam

The exam is split in to two sections and lasts 45 mins.

Section 1 is factual knowledge. This will consist of short factual knowledge questions on the WW1 and Treaty of Versailles topics. Students are advised to spend 25 minutes on this section.

Section 2 is extended writing in response to a GCSE question. This question will be on the life in Nazi Germany topic and students will need to write a 3 paragraph response to an 'explain why...' question. Students are advised to spend 20 minutes on this section.

Treaty of Versailles Life in Nazi Germany


