Contact tracing over half term

I sincerely hope that all our families have a healthy and restful half term in the sun. However, should you need to report a positive COVID-19 case during the holiday, please take note of the following information and arrangements regarding communicating with school. Where a student tests positive for coronavirus, having developed symptoms more than 48 hours after being in school, the school should not be contacted as the student would not be deemed to have been contagious while at school. In this event, parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace. Up to and including Wednesday 2nd June 2021, if a student tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, please report the case via the following

We will then assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school. Where students are required to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case after this date, the school does not need to be informed about their absence until the first day of the new term.
