# **University Admissions Deadline Day**

Wednesday 26th January, a date indelibly etched into my brain, is university admissions deadline day.

After some flurries of activity at the eleventh hour the Sixth Form team managed to get all applications completed and sent off to UCAS. This year 47 out of a total of 60 students in year 13 have made an application to go to university in September, including to cities the length and breadth of the UK: Belfast, Dundee, Falmouth and Exeter, and for courses as diverse as Ancient History and Archaeology, Modern and Mediaeval Languages, Forensic Science and Equine Sports Science.

With over 130 HE institutions offering over 50,000 courses there is plenty to choose from!

Nowadays there is much discussion about whether going to university is worth the cost. This year's students will pay £9,250 per year for their course and that doesn't include living costs like rent, travel and food. The good news is that there is plenty of financial support available. Every student is eligible to receive a full tuition loan which is only payable back once they are earning at least £27,295 a year before deductions and then they are expected to pay 9% of anything over that threshold (on average this amounts to £6 per month).

The benefits of achieving a degree are considerable including increased access to competitive job sectors and opportunities, increased earning potential, enhanced personal

development, health and wellbeing in the future.

Over the next few weeks students will find out if they have been offered a conditional place at their chosen institutions. We are very proud of some of our students who have already received offers from every one of their 5 choices, including one student who has received an offer from the University of Cambridge, a university where offers are given to only 23% of all applicants.

Good luck to all of our students in securing a place on the course of their dreams!
